L: Trusting the goodness and lovingkindness of God our Savior, let us confess our sin.


Silence is kept for reflection.



<u>Word</u>


FIRST READING: 1 SAMUEL 2:18-20, 26

Samuel was born to parents who had given up hope of having children; in gratitude, they placed him with Eli, the high priest, in the temple. His parent would indeed have other children, and Samuel would go on to become the first of the great prophets of Israel, anointing both Saul and David as king.

¹⁸ Samuel was ministering before the Lord, a boy wearing a linen ephod. ¹⁹ His mother used to make for him a little robe and take it to him each year when she went up with her husband to offer the yearly sacrifice. ²⁰ Then Eli would bless Elkanah and his wife and say, "May the Lord repay you with children by this woman for the loan that she made to the Lord," and then they would return to their home.

²⁶ Now the boy Samuel continued to grow both in stature and in favor with the Lord and with the people. L: The word of the Lord. **A: Thanks be to God.**

This psalm, like Psalm 98 (paraphrased as "Joy to the World"), calls on all creation – not simply Israel or even humanity – to praise its Creator.




SECOND READING: COLOSSIANS 3:12-17

Like the second lessons for the past few Sundays, this reading from Colossians gives advice about how Christians are to live in the "mean time," between the birth, death, and resurrection of Christ, and the final fulfillment of God's promises.

¹² As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. ¹³ Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. ¹⁴ Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. ¹⁵ And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. ¹⁶ Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

L: The word of the Lord. A: Thanks be to God.

*GOSPEL ACCLAMATION



*GOSPEL READING – LUKE 2:41-52

This is the only scriptural story we have of Jesus between his early infancy and his baptism. Like many other stories in the early chapters of Luke, it includes Mary's devoted remembering.

L: The holy gospel according to Luke. **A: Glory to you, O Lord.**

⁴¹ Now every year [Jesus's] parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. ⁴² And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. ⁴³ When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents were unaware of this. ⁴⁴ Assuming that he was in the group of travelers, they went a

day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. ⁴⁵ When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. ⁴⁶ After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷ And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸ When his parents saw him they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Child, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously looking for you." ⁴⁹ He said to them, "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" ⁵⁰ But they did not understand what he said to them. ⁵¹ Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them, and his mother treasured all these things in her heart.

⁵² And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years and in divine and human favor.

L: The gospel of the Lord. A: Praise to you, O Christ.

L: For the well-being of your people, we pray. Keep watch over all who travel this holiday season. Accompany those who are alone or ill (*especially*). Console parents and children whose relationships are strained or severed. God of grace,

A: receive our prayer.

L: For the ministry of this place St. Paul in Pine Grove Mills we pray. Let the word of Christ dwell among us. In times of conflict, clothe us in love and move us to forgiveness. God of grace,

A: receive our prayer.

Here other intercessions may be offered.

L: For your holy, beloved, and chosen ones of every time and place, we give thanks, especially Becky Nordberg, Mike Shoemaker, Bill Keller, and Jean Knepper. Draw us all into everlasting praise and joy. God of grace,

A: receive our prayer.

L: We commend these prayers to you, O God, trusting your grace made known to all, through the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.



and lead us not into temptation,


but deliver us from evil.


